

Fall Conference District 15 Awards

District 15 Toastmasters presents awards to individual Toastmasters and Clubs that have shown excellence in helping us achieve the Mission of the District, which is:

To enhance the performance and extend the network of clubs, thereby offering greater numbers of people the opportunity to benefit from the Toastmasters education program by:

- Focusing on the four critical success factors as specified by the District education and membership goals.
- Insuring that each Club effectively fulfills its responsibilities to its individual members.
- Providing effective training and leadership development opportunities for Club and District Officers

You may nominate a Toastmaster or Club for the below awards by sending your nomination to awards@district15speaks.org by October 15. Please be specific; explain specifically what the Toastmaster or Club has done that qualifies them to receive the award.

1. OUTSTANDING CLUB PRESIDENT OF THE YEAR

To be eligible, you must (A) be a club president who has (B) served a minimum of 6 months prior to the deadline date. Presidents elected for a six-month term must have completed their term by December 31 of the year for which they are nominated.

The recipient of this award is a Club President who leads his or her club to excellence, and to achievement in the Distinguished Club Program.

2. OUTSTANDING CLUB OFFICER OF THE YEAR

Any Club officer (President, Vice President Education, Vice President Membership, Vice President Public Relations, Secretary, Treasurer, or Sergeant-at-Arms) is eligible to receive this award. To be eligible, an officer must have served for a minimum of six months prior to the deadline date. Officers elected for a six-month term must have completed their term by December 31 of the year for which they are nominated. The recipient of this award is a Club Officer who leads his or her club to excellence, and to achievement in the Distinguished Club Program.

3. DISTRICT 15 RIGHT TRACK AWARD

Any new club chartered since March 30 of the previous year is eligible to receive this award. Also, any club whose membership has since reached 20 or more members may be nominated. The recipient of this award should be a club that has shown by example that adhering to the Distinguished Club Program results in club success and member satisfaction.

4. CLUB BULLETIN OF THE YEAR

Presented to a Club Bulletin Editor. At least three issues of any Club's Bulletin published since July 1 of the previous year may be submitted in nomination for this award. Judging will be based on the Toastmaster Publication, "Your Club Bulletin."

5. DISTRICT 15 CLUB OF THE YEAR

Recognizes a club which excels at achieving the ten goals outlined in the New Distinguished Club Program, thereby contributing toward achieving the mission of the District.

6. DISTRICT 15 ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Any Toastmaster who has been a member of Toastmasters for one year or less is eligible for this award. The recipient of this award is a Toastmaster who shows dedication to excellence in serving his or her club.

7. DISTRICT 15 TOASTMASTER OF THE YEAR

Recognizes one Toastmaster whose dedication, commitment, and effort make a significant contribution toward achieving the mission of the District.

8. AREA GOVERNOR OF THE YEAR

Recognizes an Area Governor whose dedication, commitment, and Area team make a significant contribution toward achieving the mission of the District.

9. DIVISION GOVERNOR OF THE YEAR

Recognizes a Division Governor whose dedication, commitment, and Division team make a significant contribution toward achieving the mission of the District.
